


Figure 1. Data collection

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foundation for understanding how characterization contributes to the novel's themes and underlying messages. This process not only enhances the accuracy of findings but also provides a broader perspective on the role of character development in contemporary literature.

Additionally, discussions with literary experts, such as Dr. Simin and Dr. Rostina, provided valuable insights that enriched the analysis. Dr. Simin highlighted the complexity of the main characters, emphasizing their role in creating deep emotional tension within the narrative. Meanwhile, Dr. Rostina underscored how the interactions between Louisa and Will reflect universal themes of love and sacrifice. Their perspectives reinforced the understanding that characterization in this novel is not merely a structural element of the plot but also a medium for exploring human emotional dynamics on a deeper level.

Through a combination of literature review and academic discussions, the validation and triangulation process ensure that the character analysis in Me Before You is supported by credible references and comprehensive perspectives. This approach results in a more profound understanding of character development and its significance within modern literary narratives.

## Discussion

The characterization analysis in *Me Before You* by Jojo Moyes reveals that the main characters, Louisa Clark and Will Traynor, play a crucial role in shaping and driving the plot. Strong characterization enables readers to understand the emotional dynamics and conflicts that develop throughout the story (Irawan, 2021). Louisa is depicted as a cheerful and energetic young woman whose life, however, remains stagnant and confined to her daily routines. In contrast, Will, once a successful and ambitious man, undergoes a drastic transformation after an accident that leaves him completely paralyzed, turning him into a pessimistic individual who feels he has lost control over his life (Dhani, 2018).

When Louisa begins working as Will's caregiver, their contrasting personalities become a key element in creating narrative tension and progression. Initially driven solely by financial necessity, Louisa's motivation evolves into a more profound emotional journey, allowing her to gain a broader perspective on life (Akhyar, 2021). Her interactions with Will not only deepen their relationship but also help her build the courage to make significant life decisions and develop the confidence to pursue dreams she had never previously considered (Universitas Muhammadiyah Surakarta, 2019).

From a psychological perspective, the novel explores how the motivations and internal conflicts of both main characters contribute to the story's dynamics. Louisa undergoes significant growth, transforming from an insecure individual into someone more independent and self-assured. Meanwhile, although Will finds joy in his interactions with Louisa, he remains firm in his initial decision regarding euthanasia. His choice creates intense emotional tension within the plot and reinforces the novel's central theme—individual freedom in determining one's fate and the idea that love does not always conclude with conventional expectations (Nurhidayati, 2016).

The narrative structure of *Me Before You* is also reinforced by the close interplay between characterization and story development. Louisa and Will are not merely distinct individuals but also serve as symbols of the novel's universal themes. Their relationship forms a narrative that extends beyond romance, delving into deeper explorations of happiness, freedom of choice, and resilience in facing life's harsh realities (Teknokrat English Literature, 2024). Louisa's transformation into a more independent and courageous individual, along with Will's internal conflict and unwavering decision, serve as the emotional core of the story's progression.

The literature review and academic discussions conducted in this study confirm that the characterization in *Me Before You* aligns with the concept of characterology in contemporary literature. References to various literary theories indicate that strong character development enhances narrative complexity and adds depth to the novel's themes (LitCharts, n.d.). Discussions with scholars further reinforce the finding that this novel is not

Meanwhile, Will, despite experiencing internal struggles due to his condition, remains steadfast in his decision, even though his relationship with Louisa alters his perspective on life. From the perspective of character psychology, this study finds that motivation, internal conflict, and character development are key factors driving the plot. The interactions between Louisa and Will not only enrich their individual character arcs but also reinforce the novel's central themes: the freedom to determine one's fate, the meaning of unconditional love, and the sacrifices people make in different ways. The decisions made by each character create emotional tension that deepens the reader's engagement with the story. Furthermore, validation through literature review and academic discussions confirms that character development in this novel aligns with contemporary literary characterization concepts. Thus, this study affirms that realistic and complex characterization in Me Before You serves as the primary driving force behind the plot's progression and the delivery of moral messages. The personalities, motivations, and internal conflicts of the main characters not only shape the narrative dynamics but also add depth to the novel's central themes.
